



2016 Annual Report Highlights

Record Adoptions

SPCA Cincinnati, with the help of many families and individuals in 2016, placed 6,852 animals into forever homes. Each animal placed was spayed or neutered, inoculated and micro-chipped. We have maintained low adoptions fees, \$40.00 for each dog or puppy and \$10.00 for each kitten or cat placed in homes.















Veterinary Procedures

The **SPCA Cincinnati** Veterinary Clinic, under the direction of Dr. Tamara Goforth, provides care for all of our animals. Services the clinic provides for every adopted animal include: vaccinations against common illnesses; spaying or neutering dogs and cats, a vital procedure that helps immensely in reducing pet overpopulation; and microchipping all animals to ensure their safe return should they become separated from their owners. In 2016, Dr. Goforth and her staff performed 4,549 spay/neuters.

The **SPCA Cincinnati** Animal Shelter welcomes all animals from dogs and cats to rabbits, birds, snakes, lizards. We even take care of larger animals such as deer, horses, coyotes, swine and goats. Throughout the 2016 fiscal year, January 1 through December 31, **SPCA Cincinnati** placed 6,852 animals into loving homes and 1,103 were returned to owners.

Volunteers

Volunteers contribute to the success of every department within **SPCA Cincinnati**. While **SPCA Cincinnati** receives a large amount of invaluable support from Volunteers, these individuals who share their time with us also receive the satisfaction of making a difference in the lives of both animals and humans. Our Volunteers come from local groups and numerous individuals who donated 22,243 hours in 2016.

Foster Care

The **SPCA Cincinnati** Animal Shelter often receives very young animals or animals with medical or behavioral problems that require extra attention. To help increase these animals' chance for adoption, many are placed in foster homes until they are ready to be adopted by a loving family. In 2016, **SPCA Cincinnati** Volunteers fostered 1,161 animals.


