Hungry, injured, and tied to a chair. Daisy was left in a hallway of an apartment complex where tenants passed her daily. As the days wore on, Daisy began to starve. Her bones showed through her emaciated frame.

As each person so heartlessly passed by, Daisy had every reason to lose faith in humans. **But you came to her rescue.**

Backed by your powerful support, the **SPCA Cincinnati**'s Humane Agent, Lyndsey Sparks, responded to a report of neglect. Someone had finally cared enough to make a report, and Agent Sparks rushed to the scene. She found Daisy in critical condition and brought her back to the **SPCA Cincinnati** — where your donations provided the love and care she'd long been denied.

Thanks to you, Daisy received care and rehabilitation for five months.

Despite everything she'd endured, Daisy was loving and affectionate. We tended to her open wounds, injuries, and parasitic infections. Poor Daisy even had heartworm, a potentially fatal illness. Thanks to you, she received treatment and care. She seemed grateful for every ounce of kindness she received, and shared kisses with our medical staff.

Daisy spent the next five months undergoing care and rehabilitation. We also focused on enrichment and socialization measures to help keep her spirits high.

Today, Daisy has truly found her place in the world. Once helplessly tied to a chair, now, her adopted mom, Morgan, tucks her into bed every night.

You Help Mend Broken Hearts

Skipper was found as a stray on the street, starved. He was skin and bones when he arrived at the **SPCA Cincinnati**, emaciated from fighting an intestinal parasite. After further examination, we discovered that Skipper was critically sick. He had a rare tick-borne disease as well as a severe heart disorder, which threatened to shorten his life.

Skipper was treated promptly for every condition for which he'd been suffering, and within days our medical and kennel staff noticed progress in both his weight gain and overall health. As in all heart-wrenching medical cases, it is abundantly clear that even a little love and TLC goes a very long way for these companion animals. Skipper began to run and play with renewed energy and happiness unseen before. It was as if a light switch turned on for him upon receiving dedicated care.

The road to recovery is a long journey at times. It is recommended that Skipper receive balloon valvuloplasty (a specialty heart procedure by a cardiologist, which typically costs between \$6,000 and \$9,000).

When you give, you help provide the emergency care and rehabilitation that gives pets like Skipper hope at a better life. Every contribution has impact and provides the resources that rescue deserving animals from inhumane conditions. Skipper has come a mighty long way, and it is because of our generous and devoted friends like you that his transformation story continues to get better and better.
