Out of the caravan, our shelter has taken in seven of the homeless dogs, traveling miles to receive medical treatment that they otherwise would not have access to.

"Our priority is making sure that we save as many lives as possible. 

- No big deal! When you leave your house, don't make a huge deal about leaving.
- In short, you want to ensure that your dog is mentally and physically stimulated. A dog that uses its body and mind will be more relaxed when you leave!
