She has already made herself known and has tried to fight off some employees and volunteers. We're working on finding a safer place for her; until then, be careful in the front lot!

Training Tip of the Week: Crate
Training Your Cat. Many cats HATE
carriers which can make trips to the
vet stressful for you and your feline
friend. Not to mention if you need to
board your cat for any reason, crate
training them will allow them to have a
much more enjoyable stay. So, how do
you get your cat to love their carrier?
Simple, by making it their favorite
place to hang out at home!

- Make sure you have a carrier that is large enough for your cat to stand, turn around, and lay down comfortably. (I highly recommend the carriers with a top door)
- Place the carrier on a stable surface with the door(s) open and make it inviting by putting bedding and treats inside of it. Watch to see if your cat starts to go into the carrier to nap or groom.
- Try the exercise of getting your cat's attention w/ treats & laying a trail to the carrier.
   Once at carrier, put treat in the carrier and step away.

#### **Volunteer Services cont.**

- If THAT doesn't work, you can try using pheromone spray (such as Feliway) on the bedding in the carrier.
- If nothing works, you can try moving the location of the carrier.

## Pet Tip of the Week - Why you shouldn't shave your pet.

Many pet owner's like to shave their pets, especially during the summer months, when it's hot and muggy outside; it seems unbearable to you to watch your pet with all their fur on them. If you're like me, you can only imagine that they must be miserable. Well, they're not miserable and are actually much happier with their coat on. Why? According to several vet experts, they say it's not good for your pet by any means and one reasons is:

 Their fur coat is actually providing heat relief. How's that? "A dog's coat is kind of like insulation for your house," explains Dr. Louise Murray, Senior Vice President of ASPCA Bergh Memorial Hospital. Because dogs' coat has several layers, these layers are essential to your dog's comfort in the blistering heat.



A hummingbird can move its wings so fast that to the human eye they appear to be suspended freely in air. This comes by way of how fast they flap their wings. A hummingbird can flap its wings a total of 80 times per second! This is what also causes the audible "humming" sound, which lends to their name. Due to the unique structure of their wings, hummingbirds can fly left, right, up, down, backwards & even upside down!
