A NOTE TO CLOSE ON... why we do what we do!

Hello,

On August 13th 2011, I adopted my boy, Charlie from you. For a few years, I was wanting to adopt a dog. I looked at many sites and even went to another shelter, but I just didn't connect with any, as having a dog is a big commitment and one that I took seriously. I wasn't necessarily thinking I was going to adopt the day I came to SPCA, but since I was in the area after meeting for lunch with my husband, I thought I would check it out. When I walked down the aisle way of dogs, I came across a dog named Charlie and boy did he speak to me! Not just literally but in his sweet smile and huge heart. For at least an hour or two I played with him in the courtyard and was greeted by an SPCA employee/volunteer. He told me that we looked like a great match and some other things about Charlie as well. Like I do for major commitments in my life I always analyze and overthink. I left without Charlie, went next door to the park and sat at a picnic table to do some thinking. I then saw a volunteer walking Charlie on the path around SPCA. I didn't leave with Charlie that day, but immediately came back the next morning when I just couldn't stop thinking about him. I kept thinking about Charlie, my talk with the employee in the courtyard and the volunteer walking a dog that I knew was meant for me.

(I am not 100% positive but I think the person that I spoke with was Mike R. (or at least someone that looks a lot like him) after seeing the new CEO interim post this past week. I never forgot the man's face and because of our talk the day before, I know that Charlie was meant to be my forever dog. If it wasn't him then whoever the employee or volunteer was, I am so very grateful for.)

For the next almost 10 years, Charlie has been there for me through everything; parent sicknesses and deaths, stressful times and happy times. He wouldn't go to bed with my husband, but would wait for me at the back storm door after I would come home late at night from taking care of my sick parent. He would come to me and kiss my tears away when I was sad, bark when we were happy, and literally come running down the hallway to my arms when I would come home for hugs and kisses. He so loved his tennis balls and would play keep away but would give me his tennis ball if he felt I needed a smile. He would never leave my side and he was one special dog. His HEART was so incredible! Every day I would think of the 40 dollars that I adopted him for and just think of how priceless he was. What a GIFT to me!

The HARDEST thing that I ever had to do was to let my dog be free of pain on Saturday July 17th. I have been through some hard times these past 10 years, but this was just the hardest of them all. The best way that I can cope with him not being with me anymore is to remember his unconditional love by donating back to the place that gave me something priceless. I would like Charlie to be remembered by the Paw It Furward for a repeated monthly donation of 40 dollars to help an adoptable dog each month.

As words can never explain how much love Charlie gave or how much he was loved by me, I can tell you that he will forever have my heart and life will never, never be the same without him.
